Thursday's keynote speaker, Tina Willauer of Children and Family Futures, encouraged attendees to "reimagine the children services system." On Friday, Kimberly Hall, director of the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services, announced collaborative efforts between the state and county agencies to stabilize the system and improve outcomes for children and families.

Jerica Estle-Grooms was named Child Advocate of the Year for her advocacy work. Legislator of the Year awards went to Speaker Larry Householder and Rep. Mark Romanchuk for their role in enhancing the Governor's budget investment.
